### **Office of the County Executive to Host Pennsylvania Right-To-Know Law Forums**

*Deputy Director Barry Fox of the Pennsylvania Open Records office will be in Erie presenting information on the Right-To-Know Law*

(ERIE, PA)—Today the Office of the County Executive announced three forums to inform officials about the Pennsylvania Right-To-Know Law that takes effect on January 1, 2009. Governor Edward G. Rendell signed the new law on February 14, 2008, fundamentally changing the way people access public records of their government.

The Office of the County Executive invites all county and city officials, school directors, borough and township managers, solicitors, authority members and all other public officials and members of the general public in Erie County and outside of the county to attend one of three forums regarding the Pennsylvania Right-To-Know Law.

Deputy Director, Barry Fox, from the Pennsylvania Office of Open Records, will be hosting three forums to discuss the new law on Monday, December 8, 2008. Presentations will be held at 9:00 a.m., 2:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. in Hirt Auditorium of the Raymond M. Blasco Library located at 160 East Front Street.

The forums are expected to last 1.5 hours depending on question and answer time and there is no charge for attending a forum.
